Day Observed	Fast Facts
Black History Month	Full Month: Celebrates Black History and African American culture in the United States.
February 1: National Freedom Day	Commemorates the signing of the 13th Amendment, which abolished slavery in 1865.
February 2: Candlemas	A Christian holiday that celebrates three occasions according to Christian belief: the presentation of the child Jesus; Jesus' first entry into the temple; and Virgin Mary's purification.
February 2: Imbolc	Gaelic traditional festival marking the beginning of spring.
February 5: Lunar New Year (Confucian, Daoist and Buddhist)	Also known as the Spring Festival, an important festival celebrated at the turn of the traditional lunisolar Chinese calendar.
February 14: Valentine's Day	Celebrates the idea of romantic love.
February 15: Susan B. Anthony Day	A commemorative holiday to celebrate the birth of Susan B. Anthony (1820–1906) and women's suffrage in the United States.
February 15: Nirvana Day (Buddhist)	Celebrates the day when the historical Buddha achieved Parinirvana, or complete Nirvana, upon the death of his physical body. Sometimes celebrated on February 8.
February 18: President's Day	Honors all past presidents of the United States of America.
February 19: Lantern Festival	The first significant feast after the Chinese New Year, named for watching Chinese lanterns illuminate the sky during the night of the event.
February 20: World Day of Social Justice	U.N. day to recognize efforts to achieve fair outcomes for all through employment, social protection, social dialogue, and fundamental principles and rights at work
February 26 – March 1: Ayyám-i-Há or Intercalary Days (Bahá'í)	The Ayyám-i-ha, or "Days of Ha" are devoted to spiritual preparation for the fast, celebrating, hospitality, charity and gift giving. They are celebrated the four days, five in leap year, before the last month of the Bahá'í year by inserting days into the calendar in order to maintain their solar calendar.
