Day Observed	Fast Facts
JULY 1ST – CANADA DAY (Fête du Canada)	Canada Day or Fête du Canada is a Canadian federal holiday that celebrates the 1867 enactment of the Constitution Act, which established the three former British colonies of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, as a united nation called Canada.
JULY 4TH - INDEPENDENCE DAY	Anniversary of the United States Declaration of Independence in 1776.
JULY 9TH - MARTYRDOM OF THE BÁB • Bahá'í	Observance of the anniversary of the execution by a firing squad in Tabriz, Persia, of the 30-year-old Siyyid 'Alí-Muhammad, the Báb, the prophet-herald of the Bahá'í Faith.
JULY 11TH – WORLD POPULATION DAY	World Population Day, an observance established in 1989 by the Governing Council of the United Nations Development Program. The annual event is designed to raise awareness of global population issues.
JULY 14TH – BASTILLE DAY	Bastille Day, a French federal holiday that commemorates the Storming of the Bastille, a fortress-prison in Paris which held political prisoners who had displeased the French nobility. The Storming of the Bastille, which took place on July 14, 1789, was regarded as a turning point of the French Revolution. Celebrations are held throughout France.
JULY 18TH – NELSON MANDELA INTERNATIONAL DAY	Nelson Mandela International Day, launched in recognition of Nelson Mandela's birthday on July 18, 2009 via unanimous decision of the UN General Assembly. It was inspired by a call Nelson Mandela made a year earlier, for the next generation to take on the burden of leadership in addressing the world's social injustices when he said "It is in your hands now". It is more than a celebration of "Madiba's" life and legacy. It is a global movement to honor his life's work and act to change the world for the better.
JULY 22ND – TISHA B'AV • Jewish	Mourning of the destruction of the First and Second Temples in Jerusalem in 586 BCE and 70 CE.
JULY 24TH – PIONEER DAY	Pioneer Day, observed by the Mormons to commemorate the arrival in 1847 of the first Latter Day Saints pioneer in Salt Lake Valley.
JULY 26TH – AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT DAY	Commemorates the 1990 signing of the Americans with Disabilities Act, which guarantees equal opportunity for people with disabilities.
JULY 27TH – DHARMA DAY • Buddhist	Also known as Asala Puja, it commemorates the historical Buddha's first discourse following his spiritual awakening.
JULY 30TH – INTERNATIONAL DAY OF FRIENDSHIP	International Day of Friendship, proclaimed in 2011 by the UN General Assembly with the idea that friendship between peoples, countries, cultures and individuals can inspire peace efforts and build bridges between communities.
